## Housing Committee Works to Improve Property Values

From the Preservation/Housing Code Committee

In June 2009, the Oregon Historic District Society formed a housing committee to begin to look at the ways to sustain property values during the ongoing economic downturn.

Over the summer, the committee met with the City of Dayton Division of Housing Inspection and members of the Five Oaks and St. Anne's neighborhoods to explore the various ways that our neighbors deal with environmental, structural and historical violations within their neighborhoods. The committee decided to pattern our own internal program after the Five Oaks program. This program has a three-pronged approach. It will begin with a seven-day notice written and tracked for submission to the City of Dayton Division of Housing Inspection for environmental violations.

The Oregon District program will be unveiled at the January 12 neighborhood meeting for resident input, discussion, and the call to help participate. For resident review, the committee is including a City of Dayton brochure that discusses most of the environmental violations that will be monitored under this new program for the Oregon District.

## Neighbors Team Up to Save the Bricks

Those who lived in the Oregon District 17 years ago may recall the summer-long project to save paradise. Pardon me, Joni Mitchell: "Don't it always seem to go that you don't know what you've got 'till it's gone. They paved paradise and put up a parking lot".

They came with jackhammers, picks and shovels to peel the asphalt to reveal the old Metropolitan Block Company bricks along Van Buren and Clay Streets of Oregon.

So that work not be in vain, when it was noticed a City water crew marked the bricks at Van Buren near Clay, neighbors sounded the alarm and sprang into action. The City crew planned to dig, de-brick, find, fix, and then pave paradise.

Several residents began calling city engineers, city water department, city anybody to remind them that the bricks must return. And they reminded them that it had been nine months since a similar project on Hess Street, and the promise to return the bricks had not been kept.

The calls were answered. The temporary paving was removed. Concrete base was poured. Bricks and sand were delivered. But the task of replacing the bricks was left to the residents.

Neighbors volunteered to help Ted Dodds on Hess Street, and another group rallied behind Ann Heller and Eileen Griswold on Van Buren. By mid-morning September 19, the restoration was complete. Caring Oregon District neighbors acted as one because they know what they've got.

Thank you to all who provided names and phone numbers, and to those who lit up the phones at City Hall. Thank you, Shane Ward with the City of Dayton. Thank you, laborers and supporters.
